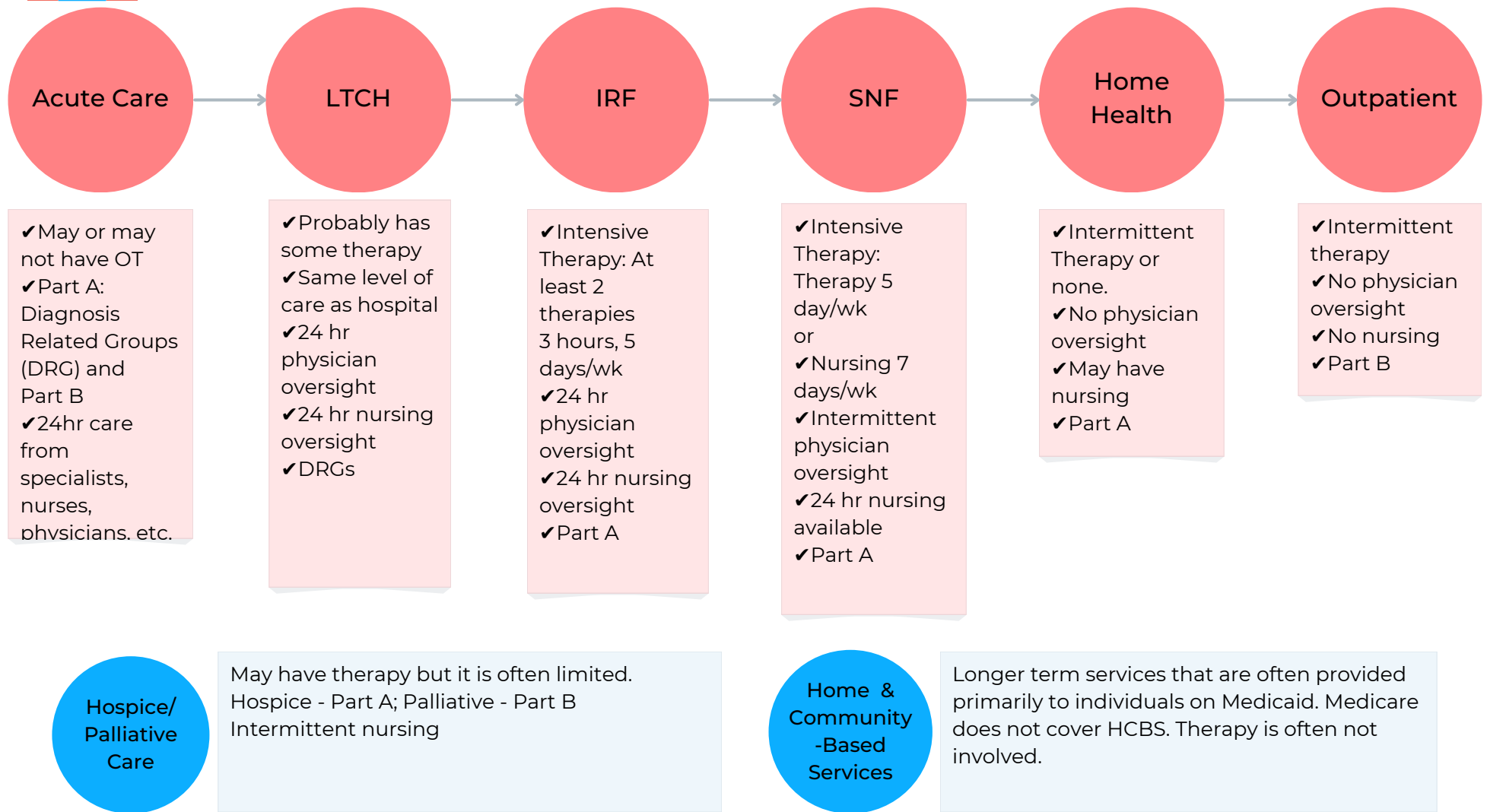

There are a few key things that will help you plan a successful occupational therapy discharge plan:

1

Start early - like During the Eval!

This can be used to set goals and patient expectations moving forward.



2

Involve the Patient

Learn what they're motivated by and what their ideal discharge looks like. Gives them a better sense of control and shapes our plan of care accordingly.



3

Understand their Insurance

Where are they qualified to go? Where will they get covered services?



4

Keep an Open Conversation

It is okay for discharge plans to change so keep the discussion open and revisit it frequently.
